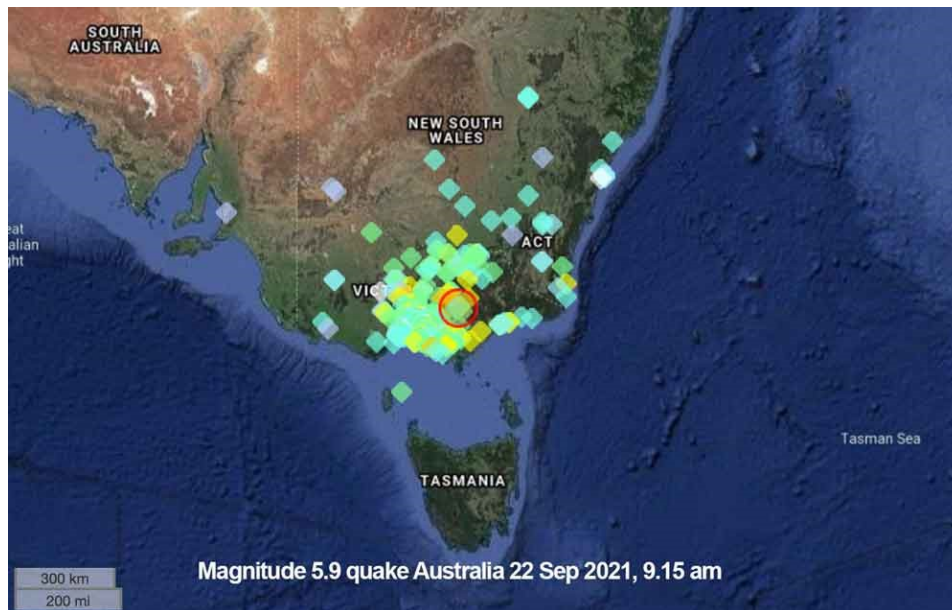

It had a magnitude of 6.0 and went 10kms deep into the earth with its epicentre being Mansfield and reaching as far as Canberra. Thankfully there was no one hurt and no reports of any damage done within the village.

It does serve as a reminder to make sure our insurance is up to date. Coinda insures all our buildings and infrastructure, but is your car and home contents covered?

## Hard Waste Collection this Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> October

Cooinda offers ILU residents a bi-monthly opportunity to dispose of items that are not suitable for the weekly collection.

However, there are things that Cooinda needs to pass the cost back to the individuals for; things that require the disposal, these include mattresses and lounge furniture which cost \$46 per item. These charges are imposed by Benalla Landfill.

If anyone has bulky waste or unwanted items, these should be put out for hard waste collection on Tuesday afternoon or Wednesday morning. For those that require help with items please contact reception to have maintenance staff assist with removal from your unit.

All ILU residents please note: Our hard waste collection is done for the benefit of Cooinda ILU residents only. Under NO circumstances can this be extended to family or friends outside of Cooinda to take advantage of. If there are any questions or clarification required regarding this policy, please speak to David Morrow.
