

## <u>Stewart Coutts Monthly Story – "Potting of Asiatic Liliums".</u> <u>Story was written autumn 2023</u>

Interested residents from AGW, LW, and SH looked at pictures of blooms in a Van Diemen Tasmanian Bulb Catalogue. Due to the wintry conditions, we were indoors with Deb, Jess and Karen assisting. With plastic aprons and gloves, we wrote our name on a plant label, covered the base of the pot with crumbled polystyrene, and then to three-quarter with potting mix. When unpacking the pots many ants were disturbed – a nasty experience avoided thanks to our pink ladies. Guidance was required in positioning the large bulb, bud facing upwards and to be covered with potting mix. Next the potting mix was firmed down, being mindful of the delicate bud. It was then time to add the name tag and sprinkle fertilizer. All participants nominated a suitable location for their pot outside their room - sunshine and some shade. Some questions followed. Blooms should appear early summer, watering to increase as it warms up. With some excess bulbs, the pink ladies were able to pot a bulb. Yes, there should be a photographic record of our activity indeed. It was a most enjoyable time with much good-natured chatter.

Note: the pots of tulips planted in May are doing well and should bloom September – October.

Dear residents and families.

Firstly, let me say how grateful I and the staff are for your ongoing patience and understanding of the ongoing frustration we have with COVID 19. Again, its timing could not have been worse, with everyone disappointed at not being able to put on the traditional Christmas celebration and theatrical skits. As soon as practical, we will reschedule this fun filled day for your enjoyment.

We are already starting to think about how we can have a celebration next year at a time that is less likely to be impacted by what is unfortunately becoming a predictable event. The evidence shows that whenever the community gets on the move and gather in large numbers – we see a worsening COVID situation.

The weather has also been interesting -I'm not sure when we are supposed to get the El  $Ni\tilde{n}o$  (dry hot) summer the Bureau of Meteorology is still saying it will be... So, watch this space!

The next 12 months will see a hive of activity as the progress of the Stage 2 redevelopment hits top gear.
